This internal reprogramming action transfers \$32.770 million from Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 04/05, appropriation to Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide, 04/05, appropriation. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 108-87, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2004; and section 1001 of Public Law 108-136, the National Defense Authorization Act, 2004. This action transfers a Congressional Special Interest item to the correct appropriation for proper execution. It does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.



Explanation: The FY 2004 DoD Appropriations Act (P.L. 108-87) added \$33.1 million for upgrades at Allen Army Airfield (AAAF), Fort Greely, Alaska. Presidential mandate (NSPD-23), issued December 17, 2002, directed the Secretary of Defense to proceed with fielding an initial set of missile defense capabilities based on the Missile Defense Test Bed being constructed at the formerly BRAC excess Fort Greely and other locations and to begin operating those capabilities in 2004 and 2005. The scheduled delivery of the ground based interceptors and other critical assets was jeopardized when the USAF Air Mobility Command declared in FY 2003 that AAAF was unsafe for landing heavy lift aircraft due to failed and failing condition of the runways. These funds will enable upgrades/construction to the airfield to support the missile defense program at Fort Greely. This action realigns the funding (adjusted for Congressionally-directed undistributed reductions) for proper execution.
