



**Colonel John Agoglia**  
**Director, Counterinsurgency Training Center – Afghanistan (CTC-A)**

*Colonel John Agoglia, US Army, is Director of the Counterinsurgency Training Center in Kabul, Afghanistan. He is a 1980 graduate of the US Military Academy and holds a masters degree in military arts and sciences from the US Army School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS). Colonel Agoglia arrived at US Central Command (CENTCOM) from an assignment in Japan 4 weeks before 9/11. COL Agoglia was involved in developing the U.S. Central Command plans for Afghanistan and the Global War on Terrorism. He was also part of the initial planning group that initiated the campaign plan for Iraq. In May of 2003, Colonel Agoglia served as CENTCOM liaison officer to US Civil Ambassador in Iraq, Paul Bremer, and worked on priority matters including the planning efforts between the Coalition Provisional Authority (CPA) and the military; the transfer of police training from the CPA to the Coalition Joint Task Force 7; and the initial engagement strategy for senior military commanders with the newly appointed interim Iraqi government leaders. Colonel Agoglia was then asked to direct the US Army's Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute (PKSOI) at the US Army War College in the summer of 2004.*
