With over 24 years of Air Force service, Lt Col Fieg has held a variety medical leadership assignments at Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri; Osan Air Base Korea; and Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska; including serving as the Division Chief, Medical Readiness, Office of the Surgeon, Strategic Air Command, Offutt Air Force Base during Operation DESERT SHIELD and DESERT STORM.
